





Scams and Other Thefts

Last week, I received a telephone call from an individual claiming to be with the Security Tech Department of Microsoft. He said that my computer was about to crash and asked me to sign my computer on. I didn't allow the conversation to continue, but interrupted with questions, at which time he hung up on me. Had I allowed it, this scammer would have infected my computer and culled financial information, including credit card numbers. Never give information to or go to a website of someone who solicits you over the telephone.

Although Pembroke Meadows has benefited from a low crime rate over the years, we have had a few break-ins in the past few months. One recent description of a suspected burglar was a 20 year old skinny while male in a red Jeep type of vehicle. Be on the lookout for that guy. He's not the only thief that has come through our neighborhood. So lookout for anyone who looks out of place, and get license plate numbers.

October Meeting Recap

City Councilman John Moss spoke at October's civic league meeting. It was the most heavily attended meeting in recent memory. I had asked him to address a few matters of concern to our neighbors.

Mr. Moss first spoke about the proposed light rail. By way of history, he reminded attendees that citizens voted down light rail in a referendum in 1999. Since that time, another referendum was put on the ballot last November (2012) and it passed. The wording of that initiative was: Should the City Council adopt an ordinance approving the use of all reasonable efforts to support the financing and development of The Tide light rail into Virginia Beach?

Although John Moss personally voted "no" on the 2012 referendum, he felt it was his responsibility, as a representative of the citizenry of Virginia Beach, to support the voted outcome. What determines "reasonable efforts" will boil down to costs. The current estimate of construction, from Newtown to the resort area, with a waypoint near Hilltop, is \$1.4 billion dollars. Historically, light rail projects have run 30 to 40% over cost estimates, bringing the cost to approximately \$2 billion. 25% of the funding would be local, 25% from the state and 50% from the feds. HRT is facilitating public meetings on the development of light rail. If there are supporters or opponents, these meetings would be the appropriate venue to make your opinion and concerns known.

The plan for rebuilding Princess Anne High School has it on the current school property but further back off Virginia Beach Boulevard.

Wal-Mart will be building a store on Virginia Beach Boulevard on what was the Wickes/FX/Bill's Flea Market property. A parking deck is also planned at that location.

The property known as Giant Square, currently vacant, is owned by Lowes. Lowes had decided not to build a store there and has the property up for sale.
