





Outdoor Fireplaces/ Outdoor Burning Ban

The following is from the City of Virginia Beach:

A fairly new product called an outdoor fireplace is creating some confusion in the application of the Open Burning Ordinance. Based on the ordinance, the use of outdoor fireplaces will be treated as any other open burning such as recreational fires, cooking/grill fires and campfires. The use of this device should be in accordance with the manufacturer's quidelines.

- 1. Any outdoor fireplace creating a smoke nuisance shall be extinguished.
- 2. Only clean dry firewood shall be used as fuel.
- 3. The outdoor fireplace must be not less than 25 ft. from any structure.

- 4. Fire shall be constantly monitored until extinguished.
- 5. Fire extinguishing equipment shall be available.

Also, there is an outdoor burning ban of trash and debris until April 30th.

Last Meeting Refreshment Recipe

Several attendees asked for the recipe for the coffee cake served at last month's Civic League Meeting so we decided to publish it for everyone. Enjoy!

Cranberry Almond Coffee Cake

Cake:

1/4 lb. butter

1 c. sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. salt

2 c. flour

1 c. sour cream

1 tsp. almond flavoring

1 c. whole cranberry sauce(canned)

½ c. chopped walnuts

Beat butter, sugar and eggs in a bowl. In a separate bowl, combine flour, salt and soda. Combine all with sour cream and almond flavoring. In a greased bundt pan, alternate layers of batter with cranberry sauce, swirl sauce into batter. Add nuts on top. If preferred, some nuts can be placed in the bottom of the pan before adding batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 55 minutes.

Drizzle:

¾ c. confectioners' sugar ½ tsp. almond flavoring 1 Tbs. warm water

Stir all ingredients together and drizzle over the top of the cake when cool.
