### POTLUCK + GOOD LUCK = \$\$



### March 17<sup>th</sup> Meeting Movie and Popcorn





### **Presidents Corner**




Dear Neighbors:

## Recipes from the Wine and Cheese Social

### **Ginger Crinkles**

George Wilson

2¼ cups all-purpose flour
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp baking soda
¼ tsp kosher salt
¾cup unsalted butter at room temperature
1½ cups sugar
1 large egg
¼ cup molasses
1 Tbsp fresh grated ginger

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper. In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt.
- 2. Using an electric mixer, beat the butter and 1 cup sugar in a large bowl until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Beat in the egg, molasses and ginger. Reduce the mixer speed to low and gradually add the flour mixture, mixing until just incorporated (the dough will be soft). Refrigerate until firm enough to handle, about 1 hour.
- 3. Place remaining  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar in a small bowl. Roll half the dough into 1 in. balls(about 1 rounded tsp. each) and then roll in the sugar to coat. Place the balls on the prepared baking sheets, spacing them 2 in. apart.
- **4** Bake, rotating the position of the pans halfway through, until cookies are puffed, cracked and set, 8 to 10 minutes. Let cool on the sheet for 2 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Repeat with the remaining dough.

George recommends you do not use a dark pan.


