
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What's good in the 'hood:

Complaints of speeding on Pembroke Blvd.

Captain Orr, VBPD 3rd precinct responds:

"Thank you for taking the time to submit your email inquiry to the Virginia Beach Police Department. It is because of this high level of community support and involvement that we are able to maintain Virginia Beach as one of the safest cities in the nation.

Officers at the Third Precinct continue to monitor the area of Pembroke Boulevard for this type of activity, but as I am sure you can imagine, we would have to be very lucky to happen to have an officer in the area during the few seconds it takes for this type of activity to occur. I drove through there this morning and you are correct that at some point during the recent past a vehicle spun their tires for several feet leaving tire marks in the roadway. Unfortunately, I simply do not have the staffing to dedicate consistent resources to monitoring the dead end of Pembroke Boulevard but we will continue to frequent the area. If you or other members of the neighborhood should observe this type of activity in the future and are in a position to report it by telephone we may be able to get an officer out there while the violation is occurring. As we cannot be in all neighborhoods at all times we really need the public's assistance by being our "eyes and ears" in the area and reporting suspicious or criminal activity while it is occurring. If residents observe a crime in progress or if the situation is exigent in nature they should call 911. If they observe something that just strikes them as suspicious or out of place, we ask that they use our non-emergency number: (757) 385-5000. Hopefully together we can correct this situation.

Thank you again for contacting us and making us aware of these concerns, and please feel free to contact me in the future if I can be of additional assistance to you."

Go-Peds



Following multiple complaints about the increased presence of "go-peds" on our neighborhood streets, I reached out to Officer Colas regarding their use on our roads.

Per Virginia code 46.2-

CH7BIOTWHDE).

908.3 (http://law.lis.virginia.gov/vacode/title46.2 /chapter8/section46.2-908.3/), these go-peds are illegal to operate on a public roadway unless they are properly registered with DMV and the operator has a license. Racing these vehicles is illegal per city code 7-61 (https://www.municode.com/library/va/virginia_beach/codes/code_of_ordinances?nodeld=CO

The majority of the complaints that I have received are prolonged use, i.e., riding these go-peds up and down the street for prolonged periods of 30 minutes or more and the noise they produce. I would like to ask the owners, riders, parents, responsible parties to please be considerate of your neighbors. We have infants and small children who are awakened by the noise or who have difficulty falling asleep or going back to sleep during multiple

We have again received the distressing news that there are more damaged fence rails and additional vandalism in our neighborhood.



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
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SWIM MEET PARKING JAMS
