

#### 29<sup>th</sup> Annual CLEAN THE BAY DAY

Each year, on the first Saturday of June, thousands of Virginians simultaneously descend on the rivers, streams, and beaches of the Chesapeake Bay watershed to remove harmful litter and debris. Twenty-nine years strong, Clean the Bay Day is a true Virginian tradition and an annual opportunity for families, military installations, businesses, clubs, civic or church groups to give back to local waterways.

The 2017 Clean the Bay Day (CTBD) was another big success with sites all over Virginia teeming with volunteers on streams, rivers, trails, and shoreline giving a little back to our waterways. All those individual contributions have a massive cumulative effect: In just three short hours we saw hundreds of miles of stream and shoreline unburdened of harmful debris and litter by the ton... and six thousand volunteers had a great time doing it.

So, again, THANK YOU to everyone who supported the program this year. Here are this year's numbers:

Approximately 6,000 volunteers... Removed about 100,000 pounds of debris... From over 450 miles of stream and shoreline. (All in just three hours!).


