

### **Preventing Car Break-ins**

It happens in every neighborhood in Virginia Beach. It's the most frequent crime reported, and likely there are a large percentage that are not reported: larcenies from motor vehicles. It is highly likely, unless you keep your car in your garage, that some would-be thief has walked by and tried the door handle to check whether your car is unlocked. If it is unlocked, that thief will riffle through the interior and take any money, jewelry, credit cards, gift cards or anything he thinks is valuable. If your car is locked, the prolific pilferer will usually continue down the street trying other cars. However, if the mischievous malcontent has a flashlight and observes a purse or wallet in your car, he will break in.

Last year (2016) there was an auto-theft ring in Hampton Roads that would steal cars that had the keys left in them. The foolhardy felons would walk around neighborhoods and condo parking lots pulling on car door handles. Two of the Virginia Beach cases were attorneys with nice cars, who not only left the keys in their cars, but left the cars unlocked. If you routinely leave your car unlocked with the keys in it, even if the keys are hidden, eventually a larcenous leech will take that car for a joyride and drive it "like he stole it."

Since moving to Pembroke Meadows 28 years ago, I've had two cars gone through by some contemptable cretins. Once, some change was taken, but a bag of bingo markers and a pair of nurse's shoes were left by the dastardly dolt; fortunately, I was able to locate the neighbor who had those items taken from her car. On the other occasion, change and a flashlight were taken from my car; the flashlight was later located stuffed in a neighbor's bush. Both times, my car was unlocked.



to keep your car safe from these callous kleptomaniacs.


