

Emergency Preparedness

Know Your Evacuation Zone

The Commonwealth of Virginia has new tiered evacuation zones for coastal communities. Now, all you have to know is whether you're in A, B, C or D. Just visit www.KnowYourZoneVA.org and click on the link to the map.

For our neighborhood, most homes North of Pembroke Blvd are in Zone D and those South of the Blvd are Zone C. Be sure to keep an eye on news reports. When a serious storm is expected to impact Virginia's coastal region, City officials will use multiple tools to get the word out, The more you do now to prepare and plan for tropical storms and hurricanes, the better you will weather the storm.
