
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Presidents Corner:

Who You Gonna Call?

A tree branch falls on your house. The toilet floods the carpets with nasty water. Shingles blow off your roof in a storm. You are in shock and have no idea who to call, but you know you need help. You could call the biggest ad in the yellow pages. Oh wait! We don't have a phone book anymore. Look it up on the web? Which ad do you believe? That soggy carpet isn't cleaning itself!

Call your insurance company. Even if you don't file a claim. Many insurance companies maintain an "approved" list of local contractors who can do what you need and take care of most of the paperwork for you. In fact, some insurance companies will give you an extended warranty if you let them handle everything.

My experience was with flooded carpet because the toilet was stopped up. We called a national plumbing chain to fix the toilet. And while the plumber was working, the doorbell rang. A salesman from the plumbing company showed up. Exclaimed what a terrible situation we had: how it was a serious health hazard and needed immediate action. And, oh by the way, they had workers standing by who could start immediately and they would help us file the insurance claim. We had no idea who to call, when they could come or what they would charge. So we agreed. We later learned they only did cleaning and demolition, not restoration. So we had to file yet another claim and pay another deductible.

We learned later we could have done it all simply by calling our home owner's insurance first.

Our insurance was with USAA. They sent out an approved contractor the same day who did all the restoration work and USAA gave us a three-year extended warranty. Picking out the new flooring was our only job.
