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

# A Snapshot of the Real Estate Market in Virginia Beach (March statistics)

We are still going strong with 663 homes sold in March, showing a 23.5% increase over last month and up 8.1% over March, 2019. Home prices are up 6.5% year over year while median days on the market is down 33% year over year (currently 18 days)! Active residential listings are up 4.6% from last month and down 29.2% year over year. We definitely have a strong Buyer demand and not enough homes on the market!!!! The next couple of months will be interesting, to say the least.

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# Pembroke Meadows Recreation Center



We hope that everyone is safe & healthy. We know you all have questions regarding the PMRC pool's Opening Day. We wish we could provide a hard-opening date but as you all know, we are on pause as are other organizations. This is a situation none of us could have prepared for, nor do we have a roadmap to follow. The conditions for operating a pool while encouraging social distancing are considerable. Please feel safe in knowing that your PMRC Pool Board is monitoring and adhering to all mandates and recommendations set forth by the Governor and State health organizations.

Right now, it is not in the best interest for the PMRC pool to begin operations during Phase I of Statewide reopening. As such, the pool board is **considering** opening the pool to members once Phase II has been initiated by the Governor. In order to follow CDC guidelines, as well as State mandated rules during Phase II, the following changes may be considered:

- A system may be put in place to cap capacity at the pool to 50 people at one time.
- Sanitation and sterilization of the pool area will be required throughout the day. During those periods, guests may not be allowed in the pool or deck.
- Members may need to bring their own food and beverages because the concession stand may not be serving during Phase II.
- Children will require supervision.

All guidelines and operating dates and hours of the pool are subject to change based on best practices and membership totals.

We have completed improvements to the pool deck, baby pool water quality, and the concession area. We are moving forward with preparations as if we would be opening Memorial Day, and therefore, we will be ready to open our doors as soon as we are given the go ahead to do so.



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The 2020 Census is a population count of everyone living in the United States. It's used to determine congressional representation, but more importantly, it's used to allocate nearly \$700 billion in federal funding for vital community services like schools, hospitals, roads, SNAP, fire stations, Medicare, Medicaid and more. For every person who is not counted, our city loses up to \$20,000 over 10 years. Invitations to complete the 2020 Census will be mailed in March and should be submitted before the end of April.
