We plan to publish a paper newsletter for October with details for the Halloween Walk and Board Elections.











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
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Presidents Corner

Yard Debris Collection Rules

The following is for curbside collection:

- Limbs up to 4 feet long and 6 inches in diameter will be collected in a pile not to exceed 4 x 4 x 4 feet.
- Two piles, generated from each house, will be collected on each collection day.
- You may also dispose of smaller yard debris, such as grass and leaves (no dirt, rocks, mulch or root balls) in up to 25 clear plastic bags, not more than 25 lbs. per bag.
- Tree removal debris is not collected at the curbside. However, it can be collected through the yard debris container program, provided each piece is no larger than 6 inches in diameter.

31st Annual Halloween Walk

In order to accommodate Covid-19 best practices, we are planning a modified Halloween walk to maintain our neighborhood tradition safely. It will be a circular route, returning to the starting point. As always, since this is a "walk" please leave the skateboards, scooters, bikes and dogs at home. Strollers, prams, carriages, wheelchairs, wagons, etc. are fine. This i• for the safety and enjoyment for all.

We will begin at the medical complex on Whitechapel Drive, turn left to Cambria Street, right on Abbey Drive continuing to Severn Drive. We will then turn left back onto Abbey Drive and continue on to Cambria. At Cambria we will turn right and arrive back at Whitechapel.

Individual serving drinks and snacks will be offered at several stations at the medical complex to take with you marking the end of the walk. There will be no activities or food at the park.

If you choose not to walk, you are welcome to join us anywhere along the route and help cheer our little ghosts and goblins as they march to the music.

Neighbors handing out candy: Please just throw the candy out to the street as we did in the old days. We are discouraging kids from walking up to those distributing.

Parents: We need your help to execute this safely. All children must be accompanied by an adult and please direct your kids to maintain social distancing while waiting to start and walking. Also, do not allow them to walk up to those offering treats this year. We are asking neighbors to just throw the candy and let the kids gather it up.

Be a volunteer---we need people to help with providing intersection security while the ghosts

and goblins walk along the route and to help with setting up and watching over the snack tables and coolers.

Emergency Preparedness

Know Your Evacuation Zone

Hurricane season runs June 1 to November 30, and the peak of the season is mid-September. If evacuations are ordered in our area, will you know when your zone is called?

The Virginia Department of Emergency Management created an <u>interactive mapping</u> tool to inform residents of their evacuation zone, with <u>additional information</u> on what ω åo during a weather emergency during COVID-19.

. Now, all you must know is whether you're in A, B, C or D. Properties in Zone A are in areas most at risk of flooding and storm surge. Then Zone B properties. Then Zone C. And lastly, Zone D.

Just visit www.KnowYourZoneVA.org and click on the link to the map.

For our neighborhood, most homes North of Pembroke Blvd are in Zone D and those South of the Blvd are in Zone C.

Be sure to keep an eye on news reports. When a serious storm is expected to impact Virginia's coastal region, City officials will use multiple tools to get the word out. The more you do now to prepare and plan for tropical storms and hurricanes, the better you will weather the storm. To learn more visit

New Financial Assistance Programs Available for Virginia Beach Residents

From the City of Virginia Beach Website:

The City of Virginia Beach has money available for qualifying applicants to help pay real estate taxes, personal property taxes, City Services bills, mortgages and certain expenses incurred as a result of the coronavirus pandemic. Financial help is available for small business owners, residents and community, arts and cultural non-profit organizations. For details about each program, including criteria, eligibility and application requirements,

visit <u>emergency.vbgov.com/coronavirus#money</u>. It is important to note that the application timeframe for each program varies.

The Virginia Beach City Council last month authorized a new series of grant programs to provide financial assistance to Virginia Beach residents. Funding sources include the federal economic stimulus bill – Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and the City of Virginia Beach. These grant programs are being offered in addition to other aid packages that have been available in the past few months. Information

Download Virginia's free **COVIDWISE** Exposure Notifications app to help protect your community while protecting your privacy.

The Commonwealth of Virginia is the first state in the country to implement a **free** COVID-19 exposure notification app using the Apple/Google Bluetooth framework. The app is called COVIDWISE. This effort is an example of Virginia leading the way forward during the most pressing pandemic of our lifetimes.

The app was created with both public health and public trust in mind. It's easy to use. It ensures your privacy. And, it helps protect the health and safety of our communities. No location data or personally identifiable information is ever collected, stored or transmitted via this app.

I encourage all of us to download and use COVIDWISE. It is available from the App Store and Google Play Store. There is also a web page, <u>covidwise.org</u>, that provides lots of information about the app, including frequently asked questions and specifics about how the app works.
