



PMCL Accepting Proposals for Median Bed Maintenance

Your Civic League Board is accepting proposals/bids for maintenance of the beds on the median.

This would involve weed management/control on a regular basis, mulching at least once a year and some pruning, mostly of the nandinas at the wall. This would include the beds at the gazebo, both sides of the center wall and the flagpole area.

We anticipate the growth of nutsedge (onion grass) and sticker burrs once the weather warms up, in addition to the usual weeds. To control nutsedge and sticker burrs requires a special chemical for which the person/company applying must have the proper certification to use these chemicals.

Please include the amount of time you would anticipate this requiring, costs of materials and either your hourly cost or an overall labor cost. This work would be done under the guidance of the Garden Club/Civic League.

Who else is ready for the SUMMER? For me, nothing feels more like summer than our neighborhood pool - the sound of people laughing, the cool water on a hot day, and eating lunch or dinner al fresco.

As you know, PMRC remained open last summer while many of our neighboring community pools did not. This was no simple task, but we knew that the pool was a needed "tradition" during an unsettled time. I am confident in saying that if you asked anyone who joined last year, they would share that the pool remained fun, safe and COVID free all season long. We are excited to be able to do the same this year!

At this time (we all know this can change at any moment), we plan to open the pool with the following in place:

- 105 guest capacity (No need for signing up for a time, but we will only allow 105 guests at the pool at one time.)
- Sectioned off pods (Marked off sections 6 feet apart with chairs, tables, and/or loungers for you and your family and/or friends that are in your "pod")

• Scheduled cleaning (The pool will close for 30 minutes every three hours for a thorough cleaning of "public surfaces" including restrooms, railings, concession surfaces, etc.

• All pool guests will be asked to leave during this time. For planning purposes, this will be the same time every day. Members can reenter the pool once the cleaning process is completed)

• Disinfecting buckets (Guests will be provided a bucket with disinfecting supplies to wipe down surfaces in their pod (table, chairs) a minimum of twice during their visit - once they arrive and then again as they leave.)

Trash Talk

Because of a recent problem with trash left in bags outside of the trash container subsequently ripping open and blowing everywhere, we would like to provide this reminder to the neighborhood: **Trash in bags outside of a can will not be collected**. If it doesn't fit in your can, perhaps a neighbor might have room, please ask permission first, but please don't leave it in the street to blow around. As per the city's website, here is additional trash pick-up information and rules.

Trash and household waste are collected in black 95-gallon containers. The containers may be purchased from the VB Waste Management division by calling 385-4650.

Please help us to provide efficient service for you by following these guidelines:

- Have containers and/or items for pickup at the street between 5:00 p.m. the day prior to your day of collection and 7:00 a.m. the day of collection.
- Keep at least <u>3 feet of clearance</u> between your container and any other item (yard waste bags, limbs, bulky items, mailboxes, cable boxes, or vehicles) including the blue recycle container.
- Cans that are overflowing will not be collected. The lid should be able to close securely
- Remove containers from public view at the end of collection day.
- Clearly label your container with your address and record your container serial number.
- Loose trash in can should be bagged, to reduce litter.
- No other garbage will be collected outside of the black can except for

yard waste.

Please do not put the following items in your black cart:

Remodeling and building materials, carpet, doors, cabinets, toilets, sinks, rocks, dirt, concrete, vehicle parts, tires, paint cans, glass, propane tanks, hazardous materials.

Please do not dispose of dirt or concrete in your black trash can. They weigh the can down, which increase collection and disposal costs. If you don't have a place to use these in your yard, they can be taken to the Virginia Beach Landfill and Resource Recovery Center, where dirt will be used for daily cover and concrete will be crushed into stone for roadbeds.

Yard Debris. This service is provided on your normal collection day and does not require a work order. Residents may place yard debris at curbside for collection by the City as follows:

- Limbs up to 4 feet long and 6 inches in diameter will be collected in a pile not to exceed 4 x 4 x 4 feet.
- Two piles, generated from each house, will be collected on each collection day.
- You may also dispose of smaller yard debris, such as grass and leaves (no dirt, rocks, mulch or root balls) in up to 25 clear plastic bags, not more than 25 lbs. per bag.

Bulky Items: You must request pickup of bulky items. Information and a request form are available on the vbgov.com website. Requests may take 48-72 hours to process. Please DO NOT place items at the curb until a confirmation email providing the collection date has been $_{6}$ received.

VDOT Opens Greenwich Road Flyover

The new Greenwich Road flyover, which spans I-264 in Virginia Beach and connects Cleveland Street with Greenwich Road, is open to traffic -a significant milestone in Phase II of VDOT's I-64/I-264 Interchange Improvements Project.

The bridge will initially open to two lanes of traffic, with one lane of traffic in each direction between Greenwich Road and Cleveland Street. This phased opening will allow the project contractor to move forward with its work to improve the five-legged Witchduck intersection, while simultaneously opening up new access for motorists from Cleveland Street to Greenwich Road.

Motorists traveling on Greenwich Road who wish to access Witchduck Road will travel across the flyover to Cleveland Street, reaching Witchduck Road on the north side of I-264 and proceeding to their intended destination. With the new traffic pattern in place, motorists are encouraged to use caution when traveling through this area.

With the phased opening of the Greenwich Road flyover, crews will implement the planned, permanent closure of a portion of Greenwich Road near the intersection with Witchduck Road, adding a cul-de-sac just east of the former Norfolk Southern railroad tracks. A new I-264 east off-ramp, part of improvements to the I-264 interchange with Witchduck Road (exit 16), will be constructed in place of the recently closed portion of Greenwich Road.

Turns from both directions of Witchduck Road onto Greenwich Road will be permanently restricted, and motorists on Witchduck Road will utilize Cleveland Street on the north side of the interstate to access Greenwich Road.

Directional signage will be in place throughout the corridor for approximately 90 days to assist motorists in navigating the new traffic pattern. Ultimately, the flyover will accommodate four lanes of traffic, with two lanes of traffic in each direction. This work is expected to be completed in fall 2021, aligning with the substantial completion date of the interchange project.



Pembroke Meadows Trivia Did you know...

TOT LOTS were included in the planning of our development. City planners at the time Pembroke Meadows was being built required developers to set aside parcels of land, deeded to the City, for the purpose of TOT LOTS. This was a brand new concept that was being tested in our city. We had several designated parcels throughout the development. Only one was fully outfitted and equipped. While the idea sounded great it did not prove to be so great after all. The lots guickly became ball fields with the smaller children chased out. Windows were broken by foul balls. The un-mowed lots quickly became an eyesore and collected debris. The City decided that the idea did not prove beneficial for the initial purpose intended and offered the land to the homeowners abutting the lots. The cost to these homeowners was \$50.00.
