



# Single Women Outpace Single Men in Home Purchases

Single women have long been a great force in the first- time home buyer segment. And now, The Lending Tree's analysis of U.S. Census Bureau Data shows that in the largest markets, single women far outpace single men when it comes to homeownership in most of the country.

In the 50 largest metro areas, single women own about 5.2 million homes (or about 44% more), than single men, owning 3.6 million.

According to the Nat'l Association of Realtors 2020 Profile of Home Buyers and Sellers, the median age of a single female first time homebuyer is 33. The report also showed that single women are more likely to purchase a townhome or condo than a married couple. In selecting a neighborhood, single women cite living near friends or family as a primary factor.

Rainwater carries nitrogen and bacteria from pet waste into our storm drains and directly into our rivers, lakes, and streams. This excess nitrogen and bacteria transform the water into a cloudy, green, foul-smelling mess that lacks oxygen and becomes an aquatic dead zone. The same pollution is responsible for beach closures, fishing restrictions and warnings on eating local seafood. Picking up your pet's waste is one easy way to combat water pollution in your community.
