

Our Real Estate Market:

Most experts are calling for home prices to continue appreciating over the next several years. The most recent Home Price Expectation Survey, a survey of over 100 economists, real estate experts, and investment and market strategists, expects home appreciation to increase as follows:

2021 6%

2022 4.5%

2023 4%

2024 3.6%

2025 3.5%

For member planning purposes, the Marlins will be practicing at the pool in the mornings from 7:45 am - 10:15 am (when school is out) and evenings from 5:30 pm - 8:30 pm (until school is out nightly, Tuesdays and Thursdays after school is out). The pool **remains open** during practices. At this time, swim team families who are not members are being asked to not enter the pool during practices. Know Your Parking Laws:

Q: Is it OK to curb park the "wrong direction" in front of my house?

A: NO! Per VA Code 46.2-889. Location of parked vehicles.

No vehicle shall be stopped except close to and parallel to the right edge of the curb or roadway, except that a vehicle may be stopped close to and parallel to the left curb or edge of the roadway on one-way streets or may be parked at an angle where permitted by the Commonwealth Transportation Board, the Department, or local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdiction.
