All positions are open for election this year with a slate to be published in the October newsletter. Please consider volunteering to help our neighborhood continue its activities and service. See inside for details.


## Indoor Meetings still on hold...

# **Know Your Ballot**

Flooding affects every citizen in Virginia Beach. We have the opportunity on November 2nd to take a critical step forward that will enable us to not only deal with many of our current flooding issues, but also help prepare our community for the sea level rise and increased rain fall that are predicted in our future.

When you go to the polls on November 2nd, the last item on the ballot will be a referendum to allow the City of Virginia Beach to issue bonds totaling \$567.5 million for twenty-one specific flooding control projects throughout the city. This funding is critical to the resiliency of our communities. The specific projects will be listed on the ballot, but you are encouraged to take advantage of opportunities to learn more about this important referendum before you vote. There are several ways that you can get more information.

• City staff have prepared an excellent 8 minute video that explains the scope of the referendum.

• If you prefer to read about the referendum, there is information available on the city's website.

• You can attend a public meeting and ask your questions: Thursday, Sept. 30, 6 p.m., Municipal Center Bldg. 19.

## FIRST GRADE READS TUTORING PROGRAM

**First Grade READS** is a literacy tutoring program in Virginia Beach. By pairing striving first grade readers with caring community volunteer tutors/mentors we assist children in becoming confident, successful readers. **Tutors** receive intensive training in effective instructional techniques and increasing student engagement. Each month the children are given one free take home book, to build their home library and encourage reading outside of school.

The research is clear:

Studies show the number of words a child knows when entering kindergarten is predictive of early learning success
A child not reading at grade level by the end of first grade has an 88% chance of not reading at grade level by the end of fourth arade

- Children not reading proficiently by third grade are 4 times more likely to drop out of school

The Commonwealth of Virginia has new tiered evacuation zones for coastal communities. Now, all you have to know is whether you're in A, B, C or D. Just visit

www.KnowYourZoneVA.org and click on the link to the map.

For our neighborhood, most homes North of Pembroke Blvd are in Zone D and those South of the Blvd are Zone C. Be sure to keep an eye on news reports. When a serious storm is expected to impact Virginia's coastal region, City officials will use multiple tools to get the word out, The more you do now to prepare and plan for tropical storms and hurricanes, the better you will weather the storm.
