

Pembroke Meadows Water Distribution System Replacement and Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation /Replacement – Phase I

The City of Virginia Beach Department of Public Utilities has contracted to perform utility improvements in the Pembroke Meadows and Hudgins Shores subdivisions. Construction is scheduled to begin mid-October and is planned to be completed by the end of August 2023. This project is necessary to fix defects in the public infrastructure and to ensure compliance with state and federal regulations. This project includes the replacement of approximately 15,000 linear feet of water main, the replacement of approximately 800 linear feet of sanitary sewer force main, and the replacement of approximately 700 linear feet of gravity sanitary sewer.

Normal working hours will be from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. During construction, there will be noise, dust, and the Contractor will be staging material and equipment in the City right-of-way. Every effort will be made to minimize any inconvenience. Areas impacted by construction will be restored back to their original pre-construction condition by project completion.

Construction activities will start near the Ferry Plantation house and progress towards the culde-sac on Cheswick Lane near Liverpool Street, after which the two other cul-de-sacs and section of Liverpool Street water/sewer replacements will be completed. After all replacements are finished, roadway restoration will take place, and construction will move to Pembroke Blvd near St Denis Ct.

The near-future schedule is: Cheswick Lane - 10/25/2021 to 1/31/2022Cheswick Arch - 2/1/2022 to 2/24/2022Westbrook Court - 2/25/2022 to 3/4/2022Liverpool Street - 3/7/2022 to 3/18/2022

Those affected will get letters from the city and we will keep you posted.


