
We also had our very first Christmas

Virginia Beach is looking back at its history, beginning way back in 1963

"Nostalgic VB" invites locals to share their memories going back to before the Virginia Beach resort area merged with Princess Anne County

As the City sets its sights on its 60th Anniversary in January 2023, its honoring Virginia Beach pioneers and proud residents with a collection of documentary short videos that tell the story of Virginia Beach, then through now, called "Nostalgic VB."

On Jan. 1, 1963, what was then known as Princess Anne County and the Virginia Beach resort area merged, and the City of Virginia Beach was born. To help celebrate the anniversary, the public is invited to share pictures, videos or personal memories that capture the early days of Virginia Beach. The City will share that information through videos, blog articles, social media content as part of its 2022 Nostalgic VB series. Content from the series will be echoed on other platforms, currently in development, where personal voices will be a welcomed resource in this historic conversation. City employees and residents may share their Virginia Beach history by submitting digital pictures or home video clips at

www.publicinput.com/nostalgicVB. Any content that is featured throughout social media channels, blog articles, photo galleries and more will be credited to its contributor. Virginia Beach City Council Member Barbara Henley inspired this initiative.

Program assists eligible households with replacing defective heating system equipment

The Virginia Beach Department of Housing and Neighborhood Preservation is helping eligible homeowners replace their defective HVAC equipment through its **Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation Program**, which helps make home rehabilitation more affordable for low- to

moderate-income homeowners who own and live in their Virginia Beach home.

Loans and grants are provided to eligible applicants for emergency home repairs to remove health and safety hazards, exterior home rehabilitation and correcting certain code violations. The program is not intended for making routine maintenance repairs to systems or equipment.

Other eligible emergency activities include, replacing defective air conditioning equipment; correcting electrical, gas and plumbing hazards; correcting defective roof and ceiling assemblies in life-threatening situations; and making accessibility and usability modifications.

Assistance is provided based on the availability of funding to applicants who meet income and other eligibility requirements.
