


At the September Civic League Meeting we will hear about the proposed addition to the existing play structure, learn about the cost and vote whether to move ahead with construction.

A New Voting System in Virginia Beach

There are changes in the Virginia Beach City Council districts and the system by which we elect our City Council representatives. Our old districts have been redrawn and we now have 10 wards. Each ward contains approximately 45,000 residents.

The other very significant change is that we will be voting for the representative from our own district alone. No longer will residents be voting on all city council members. The only remaining at- large position will be the mayor.

There is more information about these changes and a map of the new wards on the city's website. You can enter your address to find your new ward and its demographic profile. Our neighborhood is split between Districts 8 and 9.

Our Real Estate Market:

Are Home Prices Going to Fall?

While housing inventory is increasing and buyer demand is softening today, there's still a shortage of homes available for sale. That's why the market is seeing ongoing price appreciation. Mark Fleming, Chief Economist at First American, explains it like this: "...we're still well below normal levels of inventory and that's why even with the pullback in demand, we still see house prices appreciating. While there is more inventory, it's still not enough". As a result, experts are projecting a more moderate rate of home price appreciation this year, which means home prices will continue rising, but at a slower pace.
