

Know your City Code

Please Don't Let Dead Leaves and Other Yard Debris Block Storm Drains

Fall leaves and grass clippings can clog storm drains, preventing the free flow of rain water and contributing to street flooding. If they aren't removed, the leaves will start to decay and send unnaturally high levels of nutrients into our waterways. Our local fish and crab populations can't thrive when nutrient-fueled algal blooms choke the waterways. City code prohibits yard waste disposal down storm drains or onto city streets. To prevent flooding and maintain water quality, clear yard waste away from storm drains.

What You Can Do?

 Avoid blowing or raking leaves into the street, ditches, waterways or storm drains. Keep all fallen leaves and grass clippings on your property and blow or rake leaves into a pile and then clean them up.



- If you use a lawn service, please make sure they responsibly dispose of leaves and yard debris. Private contractors must dispose of waste resulting from their work.
- Set your lawn mower to mulch and mow high. Taller grass retains moisture and catches grass clippings. Mow often enough that grass clippings are shorter than the remaining lawn and can be trapped on your lawn. If you choose to collect grass clippings, follow any of the options below.
- Compost leaves on-site away from storm drains, wetlands and streams. Contain your compost to keep nutrientrich water from leaching into the storm system.
- If you see a storm drain that is clogged and can clear it without placing yourself in danger, please remove the leaves.

Outside spigots can freeze and burst.

Protect them with an inexpensive foam cover available at the hardware store. They fit over your faucet and clip on and secure with the closure provided that is attached to the foam. Cost is about \$2.50. Burst pipe cost is???

Then contact Animal Control so they can pick up the dog and provide safety for the animal and public.

Frozen (pipes, not the movie)

FYI: If your kitchen is on an outside wall as it was in most of the original floor plans, then you are extremely lucky if the water to the kitchen sink did not freeze solid during the super cold day prior to Christmas two weeks ago.

Why? Because the insulation in the original walls was very thin. I'd rate it at R-1 at best and if you've ever had plumbing work done on the kitchen drain or water supply lines, then what insulation was there has been ripped up and may have large open spots with no insulation between the pipes and the outside wall.

If you've had new cabinets installed in the kitchen this may have made the situation worse for frigid weather. The original cabinets had no back wall so there was only one layer of drywall between room temperature and the pipes. New cabinets invariably have a back wall which creates two insulating layers between inside temperature and the pipes.

Some houses have added a room on the back of the kitchen so that eliminates the frozen kitchen pipes entirely. For those who still have an outside wall behind the kitchen sink, it's worth considering how to prevent frozen pipes in the future.

As a minimum: when temperatures below 30° are forecast, leave the cupboard door under the sink open to allow warmer room air to reach the back wall.

Best but most expensive solution is to have a contractor remove the exterior siding to expose the existing insulation and piping. Have the pipes encased in wrap-around insulation and then as much insulation as possible stuffed into the wall between the pipes and the exterior wall. Finally, replace the siding.

We can't be the only ones who have experienced frozen kitchen pipes. I'd love to hear what others have done to alleviate this hazard.

Our Real Estate Market:

What are Experts Predicting for the 2023 Housing Market?

After the past 3 years of soaring home prices, historically low interest rates (until recently) and bidding wars, what lies ahead for 2023?

Most experts predict that home prices will likely remain stable in many markets around the state. Home prices have been trending up in local markets in 2022 even as home sales have slowed. This is largely a result of tight inventory conditions coupled with pent up demand. Home inventory is STILL LOW and we have more buyers than homes, keeping us in a seller's market. There is NO pent up wave of foreclosures coming to the market that would make home prices crash.

Rents have increased at a higher rate than home prices and have almost doubled in the past 5 years. They are predicted to continue rising as well.

Mortgage rates, which took the fastest leap this year than in the past 50 years, are predicted to come down slightly, perhaps to around 6%.
