

We are getting an influx of "DUMPED dogs, left behind mainly dogs at the park, school grounds and in our neighborhood.

Those of us that are part of our wonderful lost and found program have no way of knowing the overall temperament of these animals nor do we know whether or not they have had their shotsmost important the rabies shot. Thus for both the dogs safety and ours and to protect both, our only option is to contact Animal Control. They will provide a safe environment, food and care until an owner has been identified or the animal, once evaluated, can be put up for adoption.

So be sure to put identification on your pet.

### Jan Meeting Highlights: Waste Management

Tara Copeland provided an interesting presentation with lots of information. We just wanted to highlight a few of the specific things we can do as individuals to do our part to keep our waterways clean.

- 1. Adopt a drain. You can officially adopt a drain in our neighborhood with a commitment to keep it clear of all debris. Really, we all need to commit to keeping all the gutters clean in front of our homes to keep leaves and other debris out of our lakes.
- 2. We are beginning our pet waste collection program, please commit to picking up your pet waste!
- 3. Did you know that the city has a **free**, **year round boat pump out program?** They will come to your residence, marinas, etc. Please don't empty waste into our waterways!
- 4. Of course, we all need to recycle, put no FOG (fats, oil, grease) down any drains, use reusable shopping bags, plant native plants and test soil before fertilizing.
- 5. City Partnerships with conservation programs provide assistance with Landscape and land management practices to limit storm water runoff. They provide guidance and ideas and sometimes help defray costs.
